The Baptist Faith & Message says that salvation "is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour..." and "those whom God has accepted in Christ, and sanctified by His Spirit, will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end..." Even though trouble comes and we might fall into sin or grieve the Spirit... "yet they shall be kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation." These Baptist statements of faith are built on a Biblical understanding of salvation, upon the promises of God.

Sometimes when times are tough people have doubts. We wonder why things aren't the way we imagined them to be in the past. The Bible says, "hope differed makes the heart sick." This is a way of saying that disappointment is real in our lives. But disappointment does not need to mean despair!

It is not uncommon to have doubts about salvation. Sometimes we have become Christians and received Jesus, but still we might wonder or doubt this during tough times. When a doubt is leading to despair, this is not something God wants us to have. It is important to realize that

this kind of doubt comes from inside, from our sinful nature.

No doubt, you have heard that we should not depend upon our feelings for the assurance of salvation. This is because our feelings can change often in the midst of the circumstances of life. Also, 2 Corinthians 4:3,4 says, "And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, in whose case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving so that they might not see the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God." Satan can work in the mind, and can trick the emotions away from the truth of God's assurance of salvation.

We need to remember that our assurance of salvation comes from the word of God.

I John 5:13 says, "These things I have written to

you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life." So we can know that we have Christ, and that we are saved. (continued)
